The Endometriosis and Pelvic Pain GP Clinic will continue to provide management of endometriosis and pelvic pain through the GP led multidisciplinary care team optimising the role of primary care.

Description of Activity *

The Endometriosis and Pelvic Pain Clinic will continue to provide multi-disciplinary care with a focus on improving diagnostic delay and to promote early access to intervention, care and treatment options for endometriosis and pelvic pain. The clinic will enable more appropriate and timelier endometriosis care and management, leading to improved diagnosis timeframes and appropriate pain management for impacted patients. The clinic will focus on improving provision of diagnosis, treatment and management of endometriosis and pelvic pain.

The clinic will have capability to accommodate and demonstrate women-led care, geographical reach, cultural competency and support for priority populations (eg. First Nations people, culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) communities, people from low socioeconomic backgrounds and people from diverse sexual orientation, gender identity or sex characteristics).

The clinic will engage with their established active referral pathways to local and other primary and tertiary care services including but not limited to:

specialist gynecological, radiological, surgical, endocrinological, pediatric, multidisciplinary pain management, fertility, and psychological support services.

Palliative care

Aim of Activity *

Activities in the region that help to improve access to palliative care in the home, raising awareness, building workforce capacity, not specifically for service delivery. Through building capacity and capability in primary care, and providing accessible connections to existing services within the region, the quality of care for patients and their carers will be improved and their choices about their end of life will be realised.

Description of Activity *

Currently Funding up to 2 FTE to:

1. Deliver education and training to meet the needs of the palliative care workforce with a focus on (but not limited to) General Practitioners, primary health nurses, and residential aged care facility staff.
2. Develop, in consultation with relevant stakeholders, communication and support processes across service providers, including how to access specialist and non-specialist palliative care support and advice/support after-hours
3. Support General Practice's capacity to apply evidence-based practice in palliative care, and use relevant MBS items and other existing services to deliver quality-driven, patient-centred care
4. Build capability and capacity in residential aged care facilities for enhancing advance care planning, detecting deterioration and providing high quality end of life and palliative care
5. Enhance health literacy of community in regard to advance care planning, palliative and end of life care

6. Establish relationships with key stakeholders across the health care sector to enhance networking and understanding across health settings
