Description of Activity *

The objectives of this program are:

- To improve access to urgent care in a non-hospital setting
- Reduce the pressure on emergency department (ED) presentations by providing patients with short term, episodic care for urgent conditions that are not immediately life-threatening

- -To ease pressure on hospitals and give people in Western Sydney more options to see a healthcare professional when they have an urgent, but non-life threatening need for care and are unable to access their usual GP or other care providers
- -To improve health outcomes and providing access across extended hours without any prior appointments or a fee

Medicare UCC will be an equipped practice to treat minor illnesses, injuries and provide short term care and management for non-life threating conditions. Practice will provide timely, safe and quality treatment to patients.

Medicare Urgent Care Clinics will operate for extended hours throughout the week for easy accessibility and accommodate walk in patients or referrals offering a 'no wrong door' entry point.

The Urgent Care Clinic will be cost effective and provide bulk billed free services to Medicare eligible patients. To ensure a positive patient/carer experience a welcoming, compassionate, culturally appropriate, patient centered, and safe environment will be provided which is inclusive for all people accessing quality care. The Urgent Care Clinics will provide rapid and free access to simple diagnostics such as radiology and pathology, and will support people to connect to pathways of care through integration of the broader health system including the local health care neighbourhood.
