



When to visit a Medicare Urgent Care Clinic

Medicare Urgent Care Clinics give you and your family more options to see a doctor or nurse when urgent, but not life-threatening, care is needed.

Visit your local Medicare Urgent Care Clinic for bulk billed treatment for things like:

- ✓ minor infections
- ✓ minor fractures, sprains, sports injuries and neck and back pain
- ✓ urinary tract infections (UTIs)
- ✓ sexually transmitted infections (STIs)
- ✓ minor cuts
- ✓ insect bites and rashes
- ✓ minor eye and ear infections
- ✓ respiratory illness
- ✓ gastroenteritis
- ✓ minor burns.

Medicare Urgent Care Clinics do not provide treatment for regular checkups or complex conditions. See your GP for non-urgent, routine and preventative health care.
