Mental Health and Counselling

WESTERN SYDNEY PRIMARY HEALTH NETWORK (WSPHN)

Operated by WentWest, WSPHN commissions psychological services for vulnerable groups through the Primary Mental Health Care service.

Clients are eligible for 12 sessions a year (up to 18 sessions in exceptional circumstances). People who are at risk of suicide can access 12 sessions over a two-month period (eligibility criteria applies).
