Initial Assessment and Referral Decision Support Tool (IAR-DST)



What is the IAR-DST?

The Initial Assessment and Referral Decision Support Tool (IAR-DST) provides support to clinicians on how to respond to people when they first ask for mental health support in primary care settings. By using a standardised, evidence-based approach to categorise mental health levels, patients can be connected to the most appropriate local care.

The IAR-DST is available on the Australian Government website: iar-dst.online

Why use the tool?

- The IAR tool will be used by all Commonwealth-funded mental health services and promotes a shared language surrounding mental health treatment needs
- IAR-DST supports clinicians' choice of referral for mental health consumers
- The tool helps identify and communicate essential information across eight assessment domains that is critical for referral and decision-making
- IAR-DST redefines the stepped care approach to mental health care by recommending a level of care based on the least intensive intervention that will likely lead to the best possible gain for mental health consumers
- Estimates or confirms mental health treatment needs within five defined levels of care while encouraging consumer supported choice and decision-making
