The following story is in the words of an SSYA Coordinator.

Tohan* was a bright and ambitious young man that had just finished high school, but he had lost touch with his cultural roots and didn't have any friends from his own background. He felt disconnected and lost in the fast-paced city life, longing for a sense of belonging and purpose.

Last year, I met him at soccer and asked him to attend SSYA Leadership Camp, a program aimed at empowering young South Sudanese individuals to become leaders in their communities and promote mental health awareness. Intrigued, Tohan decided to take a leap of faith and enrol in the camp.

At the camp, Tohan was welcomed with open arms by fellow South Sudanese youth who shared similar experiences and challenges. He was also exposed to various leadership skills, including communication, teamwork, and problem-solving, through interactive workshops and activities.
